

Before You Rely on an AI Divorce Answer

A useful starting point deserves a careful check.

AI can help organize nonconfidential notes or questions. A clear answer can still be wrong, incomplete, outdated, or based on the wrong place. Verify it before acting.

- ☐ **Protect privacy.** Use fictional names and general descriptions. Exclude identifying details, children's information, private messages, passwords, cryptocurrency private keys, and recovery phrases. Do not upload confidential records by default. Review the tool's privacy terms and controls.
- ☐ **Check the place.** Does the answer address California and, where relevant, the correct county?
- ☐ **Open the source.** Confirm the cited page exists and supports the claim. An AI citation is not proof of accuracy.
- ☐ **Check currency.** Consult the current California Courts Self-Help Guide and your court's official website. Record the source and date checked.
- ☐ **Find assumptions.** Has it assumed nothing was filed, everyone agrees, or no financial issues exist? List what it may have missed.
- ☐ **Ask the appropriate person.** A California attorney can advise about rights, options, risks, strategy, or signing an agreement. An AI answer is not confirmation that your case is complete.

An organizing prompt: "Help me list questions about California divorce without personal facts. Separate process questions from questions requiring legal advice. Include official source links for me to verify."
